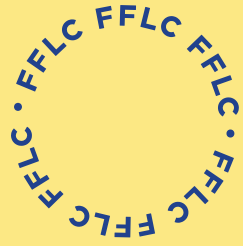

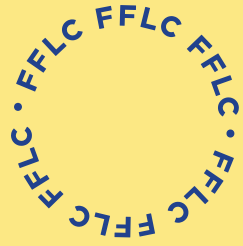

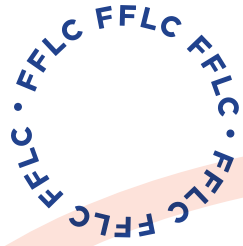

Dr Mahsa Mohaghegh is the Director of Women in Technology and a Senior Lecturer at AUT's School of Engineering, Computer and Mathematical Sciences.
